## Teamwork pays off

Students in small supervised teams "learn by doing" by undertaking a literature review. In 2016, this student-led activity saw five public, tions in peer-reviewed journals.

Year Three BPharm students Aruna Ranjan, Chu Jian Feng, Foo Wei Lim, Chai Zhi Xin, Eileen Lau Yin Yien, Ye Heuy Mien, Theam Xi Jin and Lok Yen Ling had their review "Zika Virus: Current Concerns and Perspectives" published in the Journal of Clinical Reviews in Allergy and Immunology, a peer-reviewed indexed journal.

They started the review in the period leading up to the Rio 2016 Olympics, when the Zika virus was a big concern worldwide.

As trainee healthcare professionals, they thought it would be useful to do a literature review on Zika virus infection and how to manage it. They also saw it as a chance to increase awareness of said virus in Malaysia.

According to Lok, "The process – from generating the idea, putting the material together in writing and finally to producing a full review article – was long and winding. It required persistence and teamwork."

Theam said a lot of information was collected from the literature and many

amendments were made to the article.

"Fostering an amiable team environment was also important to improve our performance via the recognition of our contribution and strengths. Our team also learnt to accept new ideas, have open communication and view each other as collaborators," said Ye.

IMU's Bachelor of Pharmacy (Hons) students have the option to transfer credits in their first two years to the pharmacy programme in the University of Otago, New Zealand or University of Tasmania, Australia.

These international partnerships are a testament to the fact that IMU's innovative education is aligned to global standards.
