"I enjoyed studying at IMU at many of its well-equipped facilities. In addition, I must say that my lecturers in IMU have encouraged me in many ways and inspired me to be a dedicated nurse. I have learned that nursing is not all about getting the tasks done and being a nurse is not all about caring for patients. Nursing is holistic and a nurse must possess knowledge, clinical skills and soft skills.

"After graduation, I worked in one of the private hospitals in Kuala Lumpur and was placed in ICU/Coronary Care Unit (CCU). In December 2011, I left for Saudi Arabia, as I was intrigued

"I started as a junior nurse in Cardiac Paediatric Surgical ICU and was promoted to senior nurse after I completed my probation. In the cardiac centre, I was given opportunities to care for many critically ill patients with rare abnormalities. I decided to come home after two years there."
