Journey back to her alma mater

INTERNATIONAL Medical University (IMU) alumna, Freya Tang Sin Wei is currently a lecturer at her alma mater. She shares her iourney and experiences:

"Growing up with chronic illness, I was not a stranger to Chinese herbal medicine. The astounding effects amazed me as a child. and I was very curious to learn about it.

"One night, my mother asked if I wanted to study the Chinese Medicine programme at IMU after she saw an advertisement in the newspaper. I answered 'ves' and that started my journey towards my Chinese Medicine

"My undergraduate degree years at IMU were challenging yet fruitful. Besides the classroom, there were plenty of hands-on practical sessions and attachments, which prepared us to become independent and competent practitioners.

"I also had the opportunity to attend a one-week novitiate programme in Guangzhou arranged by IMU, where I was able to observe special acupuncture techniques such as apitherapy (bee sting acupuncture) and catgut embedding therapy. These experiences helped me in my career path later on.

"When I graduated from IMU in 2015, I decided to go to Shandong for a one-year

clinical training programme. "Prior to this, I had a three-month gap, which I spent working as a herbal

dispenser and clinical assistant in the Chinese Medicine Department of Lam Wah Ee Hospital Penang, I was able to familiarise myself with the job quickly, thanks to the clinical training at IMU.

"In Shandong, I was attached to the Shandong Province Chinese Medicine Hospital, spending about a month each in every crucial department, including the intensive care unit (ICU). I was exposed to both Chinese Medicine and allopathic medicine in terms of diagnosis, examination and management as practiced in China.

"As I'm more academically inclined. I decided to continue pursuing my master's degree in acupuncture and moxibustion at Tianjin University of Traditional Chinese Medicine (TIUTCM) on the China Government Scholarship.

"During my three years in Tianjin, I pursued my postgraduate studies in acupuncture and moxibustion, and successfully completed my dissertation with my supervisor, Prof Xu Li (TJUTCM School of Acupuncture-Moxibustion dean) and fellow colleagues.

"While training, I assisted them in translating what was being taught to international students or fellow visitors. It was not difficult, as I learnt Chinese Medicine in English during my bachelor's degree at IMU.

"It was a great opportunity to share my knowledge with people of different nationalities and professions, while learning about their healthcare professions such as homeopathy, traditional Mongolian medicine. anaesthesiology and allopathic medicine.

"This is what makes studying abroad a valuable experience. Now I am a lecturer at the university I graduated from.

"Being back in IMU. I am continuing to broaden my knowledge and improve myself, as lifelong learning is what IMU-ians strive for."

IMU offers a four-year BSc (Hons) in Chinese Medicine. It also has partnerships with several universities of TCM in China (Shanghai University of TCM, Shandong University of TCM, Guangzhou University of TCM) and RMIT University, Australia for students to transfer after three years in the IMU Chinese Medicine programme.

Students will then be awarded the bachelor's degree in Chinese Medicine of the respective partner universities upon completion.

The commencement for the Chinese Medicine programme is in February and September.
