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About International Medical University

In 1992, Malaysia was facing a serious shortage of doctors. Dr Kamal Salih, a visionary, and Dr Mei Ling Young, a social scientist with a strong interest in development, hit on a brilliant, simple idea – if young Malaysian students could not go out into the world to get the medical education they wanted and deserved, they would bring it to them. And so the idea for the International Medical College (IMC) was born. The college was officially launched on 13 April 1992 by the then Education Minister, YB Datuk Amar Dr Sulaiman Haji Daud, demonstrating the full support of the Malaysian Ministry of Education and Ministry of Health.

Changing the landscape of medical education, IMC introduced the world's first unique curriculum model that allow medical students to spend the first 5 semesters at the IMC in Kuala Lumpur, before moving to one of the five leading Partner Medical Schools (PMS) around the world.



IMC becomes the International Medical University (IMU)

On 4 February 1999, IMC was granted university status and became the International Medical University (IMU), thus providing students the additional option of reading the whole medical degree in Malaysia, graduating with the IMU MBBS. With this, IMU also became the country's first private medical college to be upgraded to a university.

Since then, IMU has grown from a medical college with 5 partner universities offering one programme, to an internationally recognised higher education institution offering 24 programmes with 34 world class partner universities in Australia, New Zealand, Canada, United States of America, Ireland, United Kingdom and China. It is also the first university in Malaysia that offers conventional and complementary medicine, all under one roof.

Healthcare and Research

In January 2010, IMU took a bold step in its plan to be a holistic healthcare provider. IMU opened its first Oral Health Centre which was quickly followed by the Chiropractic Centre in May 2010, Medical Clinic in July 2010 and the Chinese Medicine Centre in November 2010. These clinics formed the IMU Healthcare Centre which serves as a teaching site for IMU students and plays an important role in educating future healthcare professionals who understand the importance and benefits of offering holistic healthcare services. It also extends the learning experience beyond the partnerships already offered by the Ministry of Health hospitals and clinics.

While medical and healthcare-related research continues to be an area of focus, the University also places emphasis on medical education research. To support basic science research, the University established the Institute of Research, Development and Innovation (IRDI) in 2012. Poised to be a significant player in biomedical and clinical research, IRDI's four key thrust areas are cancer and stem cell research, bioactive molecules and drug delivery, environmental and population health, and health professional education research. This is also part of the IMU's vision to develop a comprehensive academic health centre where all the three components of education, research and healthcare will be integrated in the hospital and add value to each other.

Serving the Community

One of IMU's core values is that to be good healthcare professionals, students must be moulded to be good human beings. And this includes being aware of, and sensitive to, the needs of the communities in which they live and work, hence IMU's tradition of active community engagement.

Since its launch in 2002, IMU Cares programme has played an important part of University life, providing means for students and staff to engage with the community beyond the University. From small-scale fund-raising activity in 2002, IMU Cares has expanded to provide more than just financial assistance to the less privileged. The Programme now strives to deliver healthcare, to promote health and wellness, and to prevent disease. In addition, IMU Cares has begun providing more holistic care, including medication counselling and nutritional assessment. Cases requiring further treatment are referred to the IMU Healthcare clinics, and the Khazanah IHH Healthcare Fund (KIHF) underwrites treatment costs.

IMU Cares has also looked into the education and training of caregivers, to enable and empower them to provide better care. From integration and application of knowledge and skills to inter-professional learning and collaborative practice, the programme has become a platform for experiential learning. It enables students to learn leadership, interprofessional teamwork, and to practise the values of professionalism and ethics while making a difference to communities. One of its commendable efforts was seen through its long-running "Kampung-Angkat" (village partnership) programme which won first place; out of 63 international universities in the prestigious MacJannet Prize for Global Citizenship Award 2013. In 2013, the University also won the Association for Medical Education in Europe (AMEE) ASPIRE for Excellence Award in the area of "Student Engagement" at the AMEE conference in Prague, Czech Republic.



The University Mace

The mace is the symbol of authority of the International Medical University (IMU).

The globe at the top symbolises the international nature of the University.

Gold denotes the quality of education provided by the IMU.

The seven krises (traditional Malay weapon) represent the nations participating in the international medical consortium.

The songket motif symbolises the country's cultural tradition. The bunga raya (hibiscus) is Malaysia's national flower.

The five facets of the mace stand for the five continents of the world.

The second ring consists of the logo of the IMU to signify its new charter as a University. Below the second ring of the mace are the logos of the original five Partner Medical Schools which helped start this innovative medical programme.

The original International Medical College emblems are etched on each side of the brace in the third ring of the mace. Below the third ring are the logos of the international Partner Universities involved through their medical schools in the international medical consortium.

The bottom part of the mace is carved in the shape of the Kelantanese gasing (spinning top), another symbol of Malaysian culture.



The Logo

The initials IMU represent the name of the University. The strips on the "I" represent the three pillars of Innovation, Imagination and Insight. The snake and staff are the traditional symbols for medicine, which is the educational focus of the University. The colour white represents integrity. The globe stands for international connections: the IMU as a member of the International Medical Consortium, both in terms of partnerships with many well-known foreign universities, as well as its international faculty and student body. The tilted square represents the mortarboard, which is the symbol of academia in relation to the community.

The colour blue, in its two shades, stands for peace and harmony.

Vision

IMU shall be an innovative global centre of excellence in learning and research, supporting a community of scholars and professionals committed to serving society, promoting the development of students to reach their true potential in becoming competent, ethical, caring and inquiring citizens; and visionary leaders.

IMU is committed to academic freedom and the principles of equal opportunity in the pursuit and application of knowledge, the highest standards of intellectual, educational and research productivity; and the establishment of a learning organisation that respects the individual.




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

Conferment of the Honorary Doctor of Medical Education

Emeritus Professor James Roland Lawrence

James Roland Lawrence who is also fondly known as Jim Lawrence, was born in Mt Gambier, South Australia in 1930. He received his MBBS with Distinction in 1954 from the University of Adelaide and became a Resident Medical Officer at the Royal Adelaide Hospital and the Adelaide Children's Hospital. Realising his passion in the emerging field of renal medicine during the late 1950s, Jim obtained a scholarship from the Royal Australasian College of Physicians to undertake renal medicine research in Chicago. Subsequently he worked as a Fellow in Edinburgh and London before returning to Adelaide. This was also the period when artificial kidneys had just become available, opening new frontiers in kidney biopsies, immunology and kidney transplant. Jim obtained his MRACP and FRACP in 1958 and 1967, respectively, and became the Director of the Renal Unit in the Queen Elizabeth Hospital from 1964 to 1976. It was in this capacity that Jim was part of the first team in Australia to perform a successful renal transplant. He had also successfully established a renal unit providing care of end-stage renal failure using newly developed long-term dialysis. He also contributed extensively to the evolution of more modern integrated undergraduate and postgraduate teaching and assessment in the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Sydney. Recognised for his enormous contributions, Jim received numerous awards including the Officer of the Order of Australia (AO) in 1991. This was in recognition for his service to Renal Medicine and Continuing Education.

Throughout his career, Jim has been an effective member of numerous faculty and university committees. In 1985, he began the long association with Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) and in 1988 was appointed consultant-in-charge of the International Development Programme (IDP) for the Malaysia-Australia Universities Development Project which successfully built two way bridges between senior influential members of the Australian and Malaysian health professions. This collaboration between Malaysia and Australia was unanimously acknowledged by the Australian High Commission in Malaysia, USM and IDP in view of Malaysia's need for extra academic medical teaching resources in order to expand its medical programmes. Later in 1995, Jim was appointed Senior Consultant Advisor to Universiti Sains Malaysia – University of Sydney (USMUS) postgraduate exchange education programme for 10 years.

Jim's contribution to postgraduate medical training in Malaysia extended beyond USM. He was involved in the conjoint Masters of Medicine programme, playing an important role in integrating acceptable international standards. He facilitated the selection of external examiners from the Royal Colleges of Physicians of Australasia (RACP) for the conjoint Malaysian Masters of Medicine examinations with students from USM, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM) and Universiti Malaya (UM).


He also helped organise trainers comprising of senior clinicians and academics from Australia to participate in various training workshops as part of the Masters training programme. His significant contributions has led to the enhancement of value and minimising staff shortages during the expansion of Malaysia's "academic medical economy" while improving the exposure, quality, and experience of healthcare professionals, specialists and healthcare across the nation.

Jim's contribution continues to be seen in the development of the medical programme of the International Medical University (IMU). Representing the University of Sydney between 2000 and 2005, he was an active member of IMU's Academic Council. During the development and expansion of IMU's Partner Medical School (PMS) in Australasia, Jim played a part in influencing partnerships with some prestigious medical schools in Australia. In 2006, the University of Sydney officially joined IMU's consortium of PMS for Medical Education and PhD training, and paved the way for another collaboration with the University of Sydney's Faculty of Pharmacy in 2011 which recognises credit exemptions from IMU for its Master of Pharmacy programme. Over the years, Jim continues to be interested in the development of IMU and has always been available for advice to both senior and junior staff members.

In recognition of Jim Lawrence's extensive contributions towards the development and growth of medical education, the International Medical University is bestowing upon James Roland Lawrence the Honorary Doctor of Medical Education.




Zhang YuXin Class of PC 1/13


Tun Zahir Merit Award
