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About The International Medical University

In 1992, Malaysia was facing a serious shortage of doctors. Dr Kamal Salih, a visionary, and Dr Mei Ling Young, a social scientist with a strong interest in development, hit on a brilliant, simple idea — if young Malaysian students could not go out into the world to get the medical education they wanted and deserved, they would bring it to them. And so, the idea for the International Medical College (IMC) was born. The college was officially launched on 13 April 1992 by the then Education Minister, YB Datuk Amar Dr Sulaiman Haji Daud, demonstrating the full support of the Malaysian Ministry of Education and Ministry of Health.



Changing the landscape of medical education, IMC introduced the world's first unique curriculum model that allow medical students to spend the first five semesters at the IMC in Kuala Lumpur, before moving to one of the five leading Partner Medical Schools (PMS) around the world.

Gaining University Status

On 4 February 1999, IMC was granted university status and became the International Medical University (IMU), thus providing students the additional option of reading the whole medical degree in Malaysia, graduating with the IMU MBBS. With this, IMC also became the country's first private medical college to be upgraded to a university. Since then, IMU has grown from a medical college with five PMS offering one programme, to an internationally recognised higher education institution offering 29 programmes with over 33 world class partner universities in Australia, New Zealand, Canada, Ireland, the United Kingdom, the United States of America and China. It is also the first university in Malaysia that offers conventional and complementary medicine, together, with the philosophy that health is holistic.

Healthcare and Research

In January 2010, IMU took a bold step in its plan to be a holistic healthcare provider with the launch of its Oral Health Centre in January which was guickly followed by the Chiropractic Centre in May, Medical Clinic in July and the Chinese Medicine Centre in November. These clinics formed the IMU Healthcare Centre which apart from providing professional and specialist services to the public, these centres also serve as a teaching site for IMU students and plays an important role in educating future healthcare professionals who

understand the importance and benefits of offering holistic healthcare services. It also extends the learning experience beyond the partnerships already offered by the Ministry of Health hospitals and clinics.

While medical and healthcare-related research continues to be an area of focus, the University also places emphasis on medical education research. To support research, the University established the Institute of Research, Development and Innovation (IRDI) in 2012.

Poised to be a significant player in biomedical and clinical research, IRDI's eight thrust areas are in environmental and population health, bioactive molecules and drug discovery, cancer and stem cell research, health professions education, translational research, transformative nutrition and health, analytical and pharmaceutical services, as well as digital health.

This is also part of the IMU's vision to be a leading private Asian health educator that creates value through integrating education, research and healthcare. IMU completed building the first Hospital in Bukit Jalil on 1 June 2022 to serve the community.

Serving the Community

One of IMU's core values is that to be good healthcare professionals, students must be moulded to be good human beings. And this includes being aware of, and sensitive to the needs of the communities in which they live and work, hence IMU's tradition of active community engagement.

Since its launch in 2002, IMU Cares programme has played an important part of University life, providing means for students and staff to engage with the community beyond the University. From a small-scale fund-raising activity in 2002, IMU Cares has expanded to provide more than just financial assistance to the less privileged. The Programme now strives to deliver healthcare, to promote health and wellness, and to prevent disease.

In addition, IMU Cares has begun providing more holistic care, including medication counselling and nutritional assessment. Cases requiring further treatment are referred to the IMU Healthcare clinics. and the IMU Cares Humanitarian Aid Fund underwrites treatment costs.

IMU Cares has also looked into the education and training of caregivers, to enable and empower them to provide better care. From integration and application of knowledge and skills to interprofessional learning and collaborative practice, the programme has become a platform for experiential learning. It enables students to learn leadership, inter-professional teamwork, and to practise the values of professionalism and ethics while making a difference to communities. One of IMU's commendable efforts was seen through its long-running Village Partnership programme which won first place; out of 63 international universities in the prestigious MacJannet Prize for Global Citizenship Award 2013. In 2013, the University also won the Association for Medical Education in Europe (AMEE) ASPIRE for Excellence Award in the area of "Student" Engagement" at the AMEE conference in Prague, Czech Republic.

IMU Cares continues to win accolades and awards for its unique programmes that continues to serve the community including the Bronze Award for the CSR Leadership Award at the 10th Annual Global CSR Summit & Awards 2018.

Moving Forward

Committed in its relenting quest for quality, the University was awarded the self-accreditation status - by the Malaysian Qualifications Agency (MQA). This status of autonomy entitles a higher education provider to accredit its programmes except for programmes that require accreditation and recognition of the relevant professional body. The award also demonstrates the fact that IMU consistently maintains high standards of quality and integrity in all its programmes.

The University also gained a six-star rating under SETARA 2017 and SETARA 2019 for two consecutive years for the Mature University Category. This is the highest ranking awarded by the Ministry of Higher Education (MOHE) which measures the performance of three core functions namely teaching, research and services. We were also rated a 5-star university by Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) World University Rankings in 2020.

As the University progresses into a rapidly changing world, where knowledge and technology is moving at an unimaginable pace, the IMU retains its vision of becoming an innovative global centre of excellence in learning and research, supporting a community of scholars and professionals committed to serving society, promoting the development of students to reach their true potential in becoming competent, ethical, caring and inquiring citizens and visionary leaders.

Celebrating our 30th Anniversary in 2022 with the theme of Nurturing Leaders Today, we remain focused on the central philosophy that guided our founders; Access to quality health science education, innovation and imagination as a cornerstone, as well as continuous insights and reflection to visualise and realise IMU's future. Our strategic plan aims to cement our leadership in medical and health care education through quality and to ensure that our delivery and offerings are aligned to society's needs and the digital age.



The University Mace

The mace is the symbol of authority of the International Medical University (IMU).

The globe at the top symbolises the international nature of the University. Gold denotes the quality of education provided by the IMU.

The seven krises (traditional Malay weapon) represent the nations participating in the international medical consortium.

The songket motif symbolises the country's cultural tradition.

The Bunga Raya (Hibiscus) is Malaysia's national flower.

The five facets of the mace stand for the five continents of the world

The second ring consists of the logo of the IMU to signify its new charter as a University. Below the second ring of the mace are the logos of the original five Partner Medical Schools which helped start this innovative medical programme.

The original International Medical College emblems are etched on each side of the brace in the third ring of the mace. Below the third ring are the logos of the international Partner Universities involved through their medical schools in the international medical consortium

The bottom part of the mace is carved in the shape of the Kelantanese gasing (spinning top), another symbol of Malaysian culture.



The Logo

The initials IMU represent the name of the University. The strips on the "I" represent the three pillars of Innovation, Imagination and Insight. The snake and staff are the traditional symbols for medicine, which is the educational focus of the University. The colour white represents integrity.

The globe stands for international connections: the IMU as a member of the international medical consortium, both in terms of partnerships with many well-known foreign universities, as well as its international faculty and student body.

The tilted square represents the mortar board, which is the symbol of academia in relation to the community. The colour blue. in its two shades, stands for peace and harmony.

In the last year, IMU has achieved many goals. These include consecutively receiving its international reaccreditation from the International Society of Biomedicine for our Biomedical Sciences programme and launching an interactive online module that we developed together with the Ministry of Health (MoH) around patient safety.

At the IMU, we take pride in being able to adapt to society's evolving needs and this has led us to update our existing programmes where necessary. Among others, these updates included the implementation of our new MBBS curriculum and the Dental curriculum 2021. In answering the society's growing thirst for all things digital, we recently launched the first Digital Health degree in Malaysia that integrates Information & Communication Technology, Data Analytics and Healthcare and will welcome its first intake in July 2022. This initiative opens up new opportunities for the next generation of students, especially those outside of science-based backgrounds.

The transition from university life to the workforce has always been very challenging, even more so since the pandemic hit, one which the World Health Organisation has described as a once-in-a-century health crisis, warning that "the effects of which will be felt for decades to come "

Many changes have been seen, lived and experienced: on a personal level, as a nation and as a global community. What started off as a statistic became reality when close friends and families were impacted by COVID.

The crisis has driven home the point that we at IMU have always worked toward: to nurture healthcare professionals who are well-trained and future-ready. In terms of being future ready and digitally adept, in the days preceding the pandemic, the IMU had introduced big data analytics into our programmes to prepare

you, our students, to be more digitally savvy and in order to meet digital advances such as telemedicine and telehealth.

This is why at the IMU we ensure that you also are immersed in much needed soft skills such as communications, time management, emotional resilience and leadership roles. Continue to further consolidate these qualities and practice them throughout your career.
