DISCOVER IMU'S VISION FOR CHANGE IN HEALTH

In 1992, Malaysia grappled with a severe shortage of doctors. Dr Kamal Salih, a forward-thinking individual, and Dr Mei Ling Young, a social scientist deeply committed to development, conceived a brilliant yet straightforward solution: if young Malaysian students couldn't access the medical education they deserved abroad, they would bring it to them. This idea led to the inception of the International Medical College (IMC) on 13 April 1992, under the auspices of the Education Minister at the time, YB Datuk Amar Dr Sulaiman Haji Daud. IMC pioneered Malaysia's inaugural global medical partnership programme, offering Malaysian students the chance to embark on their medical journey locally before continuing their education at one of five prestigious Partner Medical Schools (PMS) worldwide.



GAINING UNIVERSITY STATUS

On 4 February 1999, IMC became the country's first medical college to be granted university status. It was renamed to International Medical University (IMU) and provided students the additional option of reading their medical degree in Malaysia, graduating with a IMU MBBS. Since then, IMU has become an internationally recognised higher education institution offering 47 programmes and forging partnerships with over 37 esteemed universities worldwide, spanning countries such as Australia, Canada, China, Ireland, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, and the United States of America.

THE UNIVERSITY MACE

The mace is the symbol of authority of the International Medical University (IMU).

The globe at the top symbolises the international nature of the University. Gold denotes the quality of education provided by the IMU.

The seven krises (traditional Malay weapon) represent the nations participating in the international medical consortium.

The songket motif symbolises the country's cultural tradition.

The Bunga Raya (Hibiscus) is Malaysia's national flower.

The five facets of the mace stand for the five continents of the world.

The second ring consists of the logo of the IMU to signify its new charter as a University. Below the second ring of the mace are the logos of the original five Partner Medical Schools which helped start this innovative medical programme.

The original International Medical College emblems are etched on each side of the brace in the third ring of the mace. Below the third ring are the logos of the international Partner Universities involved through their medical schools in the international medical consortium.

The bottom part of the mace is carved in the shape of the Kelantanese gasing (spinning top), another symbol of Malaysian culture.
