MPU modules are compulsory, imposed by the Ministry of Higher Education under the Private Higher Educational Institutions Act 1996 (Act 555).

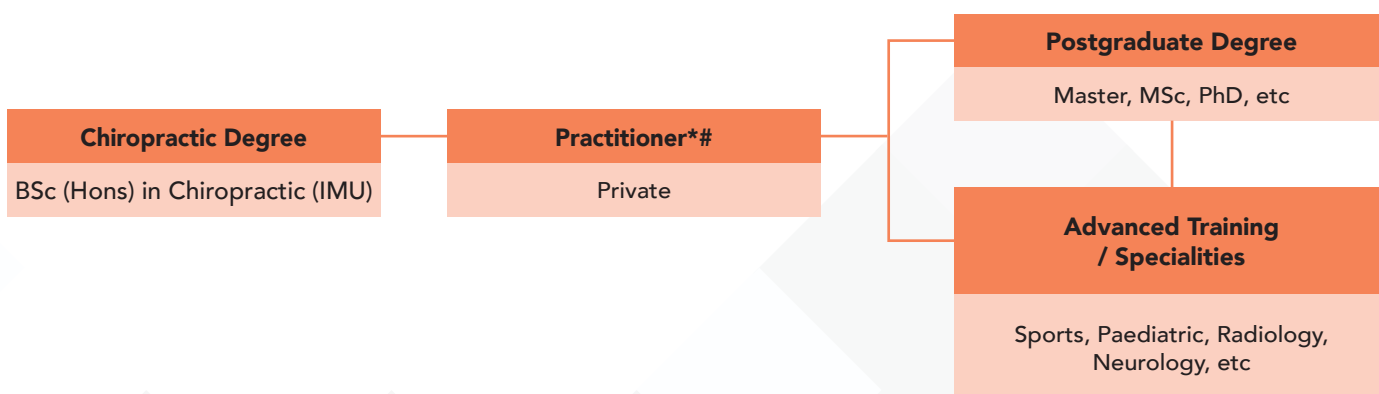
Every student must pass all modules as a prerequisite for the awarding of the degree.

◆ Career Pathways

As awareness of Chiropractic benefits grows among the general public, demand for the profession is on the rise. Despite just having a population of 32.78 million, Malaysia would require an additional 7,000 practitioners to match the ratio of practising Chiropractors found in Canada.

Most Chiropractors operate in private practices, often collaborating within multidisciplinary healthcare settings. In the United States, Chiropractors have not only secured positions in private practices but also in military clinics, hospitals, sports teams, and the fields of education and research.

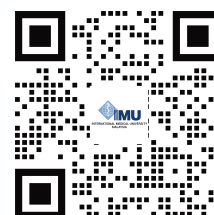
◆ Degree Recognition

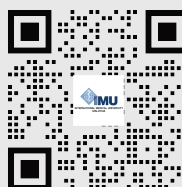
