

Integrated courses include Introduction to Health Professions, Research, Innovation and Evidence-Based Medicine, Transition to Clinical Practice, Professional and Personal Development, Rationale and Safety Prescribing, Early Clinical Attachment, Special Study Course, Precision Medicine, Clinical Nutrition. Integrated courses are delivered throughout the 10 semesters.

The curriculum is reviewed periodically and is subject to change. The MPU modules are compulsory modules imposed by Ministry of Higher Education under the Private Higher Educational Institutions Act 1996 (Act 555). All students must take these modules and pass as a prerequisite for the award of the degree.

### Note

- Full duration of study for the Medical programme (undergraduate and graduate entries) is 5 to 6 years, depending on the university of choice.
- The Partner Medical Schools (PMS) award their respective degrees to students upon satisfactory completion of their programmes.
- Graduates from IMU's Medical programme and PMS are working in various healthcare facilities in Malaysia and other countries including Singapore, the United Kingdom and Australia.
- The list of partner universities is subject to change.

### Graduate Entry

- For University of Warwick, student with a first degree on entry may transfer after 2.5 years. The qualification should fulfil the following, with final approval from the University of Warwick:
  - IMU Students can transfer to a graduate school to complete the Second Part provided that they have a First Degree in any field at the required standard. IMU will also consider matriculation/ pre-u qualifications when selecting students. IMU will also look at the maturity level of the students.
  - The minimum entry requirement for IMU for the inception into the Medical Programme with an:
    - Undergraduate level Degree at Second Upper class (GPA 3.20 and above) and the Degree must be for an Honours-Level programme or equivalent
    - OR
    - An undergraduate level Degree at Second Lower class (GPA 3.00-3.19) AND a postgraduate level (e.g. Masters or PhD) Previous Degree at a pass level.
- IMU students must have IELTS academic score of 7.0 or above with a minimum of 7.0 in two components and 6.5 in another two components of the test or equivalent qualifications as defined by UoW taken within the last two (2) years at the point of application to UoW, or if already achieved on entry to IMU, within two (2) years of commencing the first part of the programme.

Students without a first degree will have to spend another half a year to complete the IMU Bachelor in Medical Sciences (Hons). Tuition fees for this programme is for Semester 6 and 7.

- For University of New South Wales, students are required to complete the IMU Bachelor in Medical Sciences (Hons) prior to transfer. UNSW however, accepts other First Degree on case to case basis.

Students should check the relevant Medical Council websites for the latest updates on university recognition by the Medical Council of respective countries. IMU does not guarantee that students will be matched to Partner Universities that have recognition from their home / local medical council.

# Bachelor in Medical Sciences (BMedSc) programme

## Your bridge to greater things.

Upon completion of Medical Sciences, you will qualify for a 2-semester programme to do research and submit a dissertation. This is a requirement for students choosing to continue Clinical Sciences in a Partner Medical University (see chart for details). Students will be supervised on the preparation of research proposal, designing and executing of research methodology using various scientific tools, data analysis, presentation and preparation of the dissertation and manuscripts for publication. At the end of this programme, you will be equipped with new knowledge and added practical experience. The programme also remains an option for students continuing on to Clinical Sciences in IMU or partners who do not require it.
